Camrose County.....

Mc Happy Day on May 8 was a wonderful way to greet people at the front counter as well in the drive through at the east side McDonalds early in the morning. Myself, and Reeve Troutman each took a 2-hour shift to promote fundraising of Ronald McDonald house and children's charities.

Public work is hard at work this spring repairing roads as you may have seen if you came across the work being done by Kelsey with some shoulder pulling and packing. On township road 450 near the intersection of range road 184, there is a small stretch of road that sits between 2 small sloughs. Water on each side of the road always presents a challenge with the base of the road being wet. I received calls and texts from concerned neighbours who use the road daily, especially this time of year to move equipment. I asked the public works manager about the road work being done and he assured me that the short term pain will be worth the longterm gain. Public works is very responsive to road concerns when concerns or complaints are received through the online reporting tool. It is easy to do, by going to the top of the main page, clicking on the square tiles, choosing "I want to", clicking on "report" then choosing the road issue. This form allows you to voice your concerns and even attach photos. The form is instantly received by the department head who is working that day and in the evening whoever is on call.

With the bentonite extraction plans south of Rosalind, there have been many who have questioned the process of the Municipal Planning Commission. Here is some information about the steps that are taken. Because the timelines set out in legislation require development decisions to be made promptly, most development permits are approved before public circulation — which can sometimes make it feel like decisions are made without public input. This is a common concern, and it's one we understand. In reality, municipal planning is designed to balance efficient decision-making with community engagement.

Council and administration work hard to stay on top of community concerns and priorities by listening to residents, monitoring emerging issues, and keeping lines of communication open. We strive to make decisions that reflect the broader goals and values of the community, while still respecting the rules set out in the Municipal Government Act and our local planning documents. While we may not be able to consult on each individual development permit due to legislated timelines, we are always open to conversations and encourage ongoing dialogue about development trends, community growth, and planning goals.

While we always strive to make the best decisions for the community, we recognize that we don't always get it exactly right — especially when it comes to capturing the full range of community sentiment. That's why Alberta's planning system includes a strong and independent appeal process. It's there to ensure fairness, transparency, and accountability in the decision-making process.

Boat launch at Pelican Point is waiting for permits from Alberta Environment. This may take some time, but our County is on top of it to ensure the work can be done as quickly as possible.
